



TIME TO BE COUNTED April 1, 2020, is National Census Day!



Most people have received instructions in the mail from the National Census Bureau on how to complete the c e n s u s o n l i n e a t <u>2020census.gov</u>. Please take a few minutes to get counted.

DID YOU KNOW: Census data informs federal funding for more than 100 programs, school lunches, including highway construction, and education. The United States population grew 9.7% between 2000 and 2010, from 281,421,906 to 308,745,538. As a result of population changes between 2000 and 2010, eight states gained seats House in the Оf Representatives and 10 states had fewer seats in the House of Representatives. Census results have a direct impact on how revenue from a gas tax are allocated across the state.

NATIVE AMERICAN MINISTRIES SUNDAY (NAMS)

NAMS serves to remind United Methodists of the gifts and contributions made by Native Americans to our society. With more than 20,000 Native Americans within the denomination, this special Sunday helps to ensure that Native American United Methodist leaders are recognized.

Officially recognized in 1988, NAMS has been celebrated on the 3rd Sunday of Easter since 1989, on April 19, 2020. In 2019 you gave \$541,784



toward the ministries funded by NAMS. Your gifts will go to develop and strengthen Native American ministries in our Annual Conference, Native American rural, urban, reservation ministries and communities relating to the General Board of Global Ministries.

It also provides scholarships for Native Americans attending United Methodist schools of theology distributed by the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry. Give on line through our website's Home page. Look for "Special Sunday Giving" in the dark blue box.

THE CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT

Under the new law, the individual charitable contribution limitation of 60% of adjusted gross income for the 2020 tax year is suspended.
